Jennifer Bisser - Director, Morningside Area Alliance

- represents organizations located in Morningside Heights, from colleges to theological organizations to arts organizations
- Events digest published on Wednesdays, with public events and promotions available.

- La Salle Open Street official Open Street initiative every Thursdays from May-Oct. with improved programming and events (4-9 PM) between Broadway and Claremont.
- Active promoter of tourism, culture, and the arts in Harlem with the Harlem Culture Crawl.
- A Harlem Arts Festival was proposed and future networking/planning began.

Maya Cunningham - Max Roach at 100 Centennial Legacy Project, Themba Arts and Culture

- Themba Arts and Culture 501(C)3 organization to preserve African and African-American Culture in the African Diaspora.
- Projects: Max roach at 100 Centennial Legacy, and Langston Hughes Legacy. Additionally the organization provides culturally sensitive musical curricula to public schools.
- Provides many programs across the country for many ages, with further details to be found on their website, ethnomusicologyinaction.org
- Max Roach Centennial Legacy Project conceived by Charles Tolliver & Maya Cunningham. Tolliver worked alongside Max Roach in his band
 - Event will celebrate Roach's legacy and integral part in the jazz & bebop movement, Civil Rights movement, and in teaching jazz and traditionally African American music.
 - Multi-city project with direction from all over the country.
 - Activities: concert tour, Symposium at the University of Pittsburgh, Panel Discussions across universities, edited volume of essays, and programming for New York Public Schools
 - Requests assistance from CB9 in support of an Honorary Street Co-Naming at Central Park West and West 101st Street, naming it "Max Roach Way." Envisions elected officials speaking, and additional musical presentations at the renaming. Hoping for Friday September 20th.

Tova Peterson - desires to get back into teaching and organizing Argentine Tango dances
